2. Let's now look at **Matthew 25:31–46**. As you read, pay attention to how Jesus identifies Himself in the passage and how He connects Himself to the needs of others. What stands out to you about the way Jesus speaks about serving? What does this passage reveal about how personally He takes the way we respond to the needs around us?

3. Sometimes our hesitation to serve comes from feeling like what we have is too small to matter. Read **Mark 12:41–44**. What does Jesus pay attention to? What does this reveal about how He measures what is offered? How might this challenge the way you view what you have to give?

4. Sometimes our hesitation to serve comes from concern. We may wonder whether stepping in means carrying more than we can handle or committing indefinitely. Read **Luke 10:25–37**. Pay attention to what the Samaritan does, how far he goes, and where his involvement ends. What do you notice about the scope of his responsibility? What stands out about what he does and what he does not do?

- a. How might this passage reshape the way you think about serving and long-term commitment? What could it look like to serve faithfully within the portion you are called to in this season?
5. Scripture teaches that we are being formed into the likeness of Christ **Romans 8:29**. Growth happens in private devotion **Matthew 6:6** and in serving one another as the body of Christ **Romans 12:4–8**; How does seeing serving as part of your spiritual formation reshape the way you view involvement in the life of the church? Where might God be inviting you to grow through serving in this season?

TAKING IT HOME:

Serving is about obedience and trust. Notice where God is reconnecting you. Let yourself be known again. Offer what you have.

The question is not, “Am I doing enough?” but, “Am I responding to where God is leading me?” This week, ask: Where is God inviting me to trust Him with my time and capacity? Is there a step of obedience I have been postponing? Trust that as you walk in obedience, God will sustain you.



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
