For the week of January 18 & 19, 2023

Welcome to the Winter Semester of Heart Crews!

At your first meeting, you will take time to get acquainted or reacquainted with the members of your crew, as well as discuss the Heart Crew Covenant. The homework has been shortened this week to allow ample time to accomplish these things.

To prepare, attend or watch the weekend message, take time to focus on the questions below and be prepared to share your answers with your crew. Have a great first meeting as you come together!

MY STORY

- 1. Why did you join a Heart Crew this semester? What are you looking forward to most in your Heart Crew?
- 2. Looking back at your notes from this week's teaching, was there anything that particularly caught your attention, challenged, or confused you?

DIGGING DEEPER

- 1. We are in a series about the mindsets we should have called "Get Your Mind Right." Pastor Heath gave an incredible message on the lens of creativity this past weekend and challenged us to think about how God might want to use a creative mindset in our lives.
 - a. As we get started, write down some mindsets you have about life, positive or negative.

- b. On a scale of 1-10, with 10 being high, how creative are you? Remember, this is not artistic but creative.
- c. When have you been hurt, disappointed, embarrassed, or ashamed in a way that kept you from taking a creative risk? What did you miss trying because of those feelings?

- 2. Pastor Heath shared a few different examples of creativity from the Bible. He mentioned Noah, Joseph, Paul, etc.
 - a. Take a few minutes to jot down all the accounts in the Bible you can think of where you see creative thinking and write down how the creativity was displayed.

TAKING IT HOME

Just like the study of children and creativity showed, there are so many things in this world that can squash our creativity. This week, spend some time reflecting on 2 Corinthians 4:18 and ask God to heal anything that has hurt you, disappointed you, embarrassed you, or made you ashamed, and therefore made you afraid to take a risk.

THE PURPOSE OF HEART CREWS

SHARE

Each week we'll study a section from God's Word that relates to the previous weekend's message or an appropriate personal growth topic. Our goal is to connect to the love of God and make an eternal difference.

SUPPORT

Each week we'll learn how to take care of one another as Christ commanded (John 15:9-13). This care can take many forms, such as prayer, encouragement, listening, challenging one another, and meeting real needs.

SERVE

Spiritual growth is fostered not only by what we gain through the support and input of others, but also through service to others. The role each of us fills is important to the health of the church and for us to be the hands and feet of Jesus to the community in which we live (Ephesians 4:11-16). Throughout the semester, it is our hope that you can find and/or be affirmed in the ways God has designed you to serve and make a difference in God's Kingdom.
